Principles of analgesic use. Analgesic ladder. Prevention of side effects of pain treatment. Invasive methods for pain treatment. Concept of Total pain. 4. Patients at the end of life. Symptoms management. Emergencies in palliative medicine.

## EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVE:

Students knows the principles of palliative long-term care and hospice care. Students knows the rules of interdisciplinary approach to patient requiring palliative care and understands the role of physician in an interdisciplinary team. Students knows the causes, pathomechanisms, symptoms, assessment of severity and principles of treating somatic symptoms in various stages of cancer. Students knows and understands the importance of palliative medicine and symptomatic treatment of: pain, dyspnoea, anxiety, depression, fatigue, constipation, nausea and vomiting, cachexia, bedsores, lymphoedema, etc. Students knows diffrent forms of palliative treatment: chemotherapy, radiotherapy, hormonal treatment, surgery, pharmacotherapy. Students understands the need to communicate with the patient and his family, knows the rules of professional guidance, and the ethical priorities/dilemmas of the patient in the terminal phase and his family.
